* Given - All shown by these Owners: That Mrs. F. W. Finch, 813 Baltimore Street, Towson,
 Md. 21286; David Alexander, 44 S. R. Alexander - Summers, Emory and State of
 North side of Kings Street at a point thirty-two rods west of the section line
 dividing section thirteen and fourteen, numbering East One Hundred and fifty-three
 rods and half rods; thence North seventy rods; thence West One Hundred and fifty-three
 rods and half rods to the N. E. corner of the Fair Ground; thence South
 West ninety rods more or less to the North East corner of the Fair Ground;
 thence West thirty rods to Henry Phillips etc.; thence with two lots and
 about 20° west to the place of beginning, containing fifty-two acres and
 60° or there more or less.

Adams Street is thirty feet wide and terminates at lot No 2, on the West
 boundary street is sixty feet wide and terminates at the Fair Ground on the West.
 Forsyth Street is six feet wide and terminates at lot 107 on the North.
 Center Street is sixty feet wide dividing lots No 4, 5, 8, 12 & 13.

Lot No 1 is bounded on the North by the Fair Ground; thence by a line with
 Henry Phillips property and South 20° west to Kings Street; thence East thirty

rods; thence North Western and One half rods; thence East 24 rods; thence
 North Twenty-five rods and thence West.

No 2 Bounded North and South thirty three rods and seven lines and - East and West
 twelve rods and half lines. 24 x 20 +

West Twenty adds more or less to the South East corner of the Fair Ground; thence south
thence West Thirty rods to Army Philadelphia Street; thence north with two lots and
600 cereals more or less.

Adams Street is thirty feet wide and terminates at lot No 2, on the West
thence by street is sixty feet wide and terminates at the Fair Ground on the West.
Fronted street is 56 feet wide and terminates at lot No 17 on the North.
Baker Street is sixty feet wide terminating lot No 4, 5, 8, 12 & 13.

 thirty rods $\frac{1}{2}$ eight links; Lot No 3, extends north $\frac{1}{2}$ South twenty rods $\frac{1}{2}$ eight
 links and extends East $\frac{1}{2}$ West twenty rods and seven links.
 Lot No 4 extends north $\frac{1}{2}$ South twenty rods and seven links East $\frac{1}{2}$ West twenty rods and
 seven links; Lot 5, extends north $\frac{1}{2}$ South sixteen $\frac{1}{2}$ One half, and extends
 East $\frac{1}{2}$ West, twenty rods and seven links; Lot No 6, extends North $\frac{1}{2}$ South
 sixteen rods and $\frac{1}{2}$ links and extends East $\frac{1}{2}$ West, twenty rods and seven links;
